Then one of our fellow student gave a speech about Constitution Day and point out various important part of it.


The chief guest enlightened the students. Dr. Shreekant Jagtap sir guided the students by spread some awareness about constitution. He also stated the importance and history of it.

The program concluded with vote of thanks giving by Asst. Prof. Monika Jogdand.













The Goonj Festival organized a Gang Day, providing students with an exciting opportunity to showcase their diverse talents. This event encouraged participants to demonstrate their skills in









